Edukite Competition - Cape Town International Kite Festival 2015

The annual **Edukite Competition** is open to primary schools and schools for learners with special educational needs. Participants had until the end of October to work on their kite arches which they then presented and flew at the 21st Cape Town International Kite Festival in Muizenberg, proudly hosted by Cape Mental Health and supported by SuperSport's Let's Play. The competition gives learners the opportunity to be part of Africa's biggest kite festival, to meet kite experts from around the world and have fun with children with a range of abilities.

Each school that entered was given a free kite-making kit that contains blank kites to decorate with the learners' interpretation of the festival's theme '*Dancing in the Wind*'. SuperSport's Let's Play initiative sponsored prizes of sporting equipment to the value of R3 000 (1st place); R2 000 (2nd place) and R1 000 (3rd place) in both categories (primary and special education schools).

For the past 10 year's SuperSport's Let's Play has been helping school children around South Africa participate in sport and physical play. 'Kiting is affordable and accessible – it's a fantastic activity that encourages children to get outside and be physically active. We are proud to support the annual Cape Town International Kite Festival and encourage children everywhere to go fly a kite,' says Vaughn Bishop, SuperSport's CSI Manager.
