Competition invitation

Teams from primary schools, including children with special educational needs, are invited to enter the Edukite Competition which takes place on Saturday 29 October 2016. This is an opportunity for learners with different abilities to learn how to make a kite. The learners will decorate their kites, interpreting and illustrating the theme 'Born to Fly'. All materials needed for the kites will be supplied. Accommodation will be made for learners with special educational needs.

Theme: 'Born to Fly'

Cape Mental Health has chosen the theme 'Born to Fly' for this year's Edukite Competition. The theme suggests that we have a purpose in life and that we all have the right to learn, to develop our abilities, and to achieve personal heights. We are born to fly, regardless of our abilities or age or background. There may be challenges that prevent us from taking to the air or from flying as high as we would like, but when other people believe in us and recognise our abilities and our rights, we can achieve what may seem impossible. This message holds true for all learners who want to be accepted, encouraged and fly as high as they can.

Prizes

The completed kites will be judged by a panel of judges, including kilters. The judging will be divided into two categories, one for children from mainstream schools and the other for children with special educational needs. Prizes will be awarded to the winning schools: there will be a first, second and third place prize in each category. More details regarding the prizes will be provided in due course.

Registration

There is no fee to enter the competition. School teams will receive complimentary armbands for 4 learners and 1 educator per school.

Competition information & rules

- Please note the registration closes **Wednesday 31 August 2016**.
- We can accommodate 40 schools.
- All learners must be accompanied by an educator. Cape Mental Health will not be held responsible for the learners during the competition or the festival.
- All the necessary materials needed for the kite-making will be provided at no cost. The materials will be delivered to the school six weeks ahead (mid-September) of the Edukite Competition/ Kite Festival.
- Learners are responsible for their own transport to and from Zandvlei, Muizenberg, and must please provide their own lunch.
- Vehicles transporting learners with disabilities will be allowed to come onto the site and drop learners off at the marquee. **Please notify us beforehand if you need this accommodation.**
- There will be a mass fly of the kites in the kiting arena before the prize-giving. The approximate time of the prize-giving is 12:00 (noon) to 12:30.

Grade R Colouring-in Competition

This is a popular initiative sponsored by Lewis Stores to include younger school learners. We will include 10 colouring-in sheets, which can be photocopied as many times as the school wishes. The Grade R learner should colour in the sheet and bring it to the Kite Festival on either Saturday or Sunday to be eligible for ONE free child entry to the festival.
